Re: **One-Way Pairs Project Update**

The objective of this memorandum is to provide an update on the status and next steps for the One-Way Pairs Feasibility Study. The dedicated project webpage is available at [One-Way Pairs Project Website](#)

The One-Way Pairs concept is a legacy initiative that has been discussed and reviewed in the past. The study is a collaborative effort between the City, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization, Broward County, and the Downtown Development Authority.

The concept includes converting Andrews Avenue and 3 Avenue to one-way streets between SE 17 Street and Sunrise Boulevard with the intent to create more efficient intersections and traffic flow by reducing the number of traffic signal phases, creating dedicated transit lanes, and adding space for pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure. Kimley-Horn will be evaluating several different scenarios including clockwise flow, counterclockwise flow, and an alternative scenario.

On February 20, 2024, the City Commission approved an agreement with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. (Kimley-Horn) for consulting services to complete this study, and the effort commenced on April 1, 2024. Kimley-Horn has completed the existing conditions assessment, traffic data collection, future year travel demand assessment, and held the first of three public meetings on September 4, 2024. The meeting, attended by approximately 50 people, introduced the project scope, timeline, and provided attendees with the opportunity to ask questions. The feedback was used by Kimley-Horn to complete the feasibility review and develop concepts.

The second public meeting will be held on Monday, February 24, 2025, 6:30 pm. at ArtServe Auditorium located at 1350 East Sunrise Boulevard. At this meeting, Kimley-Horn will present a high-level review of the future operations for each scenario. Additionally, the outline of the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats Assessment will be presented.

The final public meeting is tentatively planned within the next two months, where the project team will present the preliminary concept plans for each scenario and the final feasibility analysis.

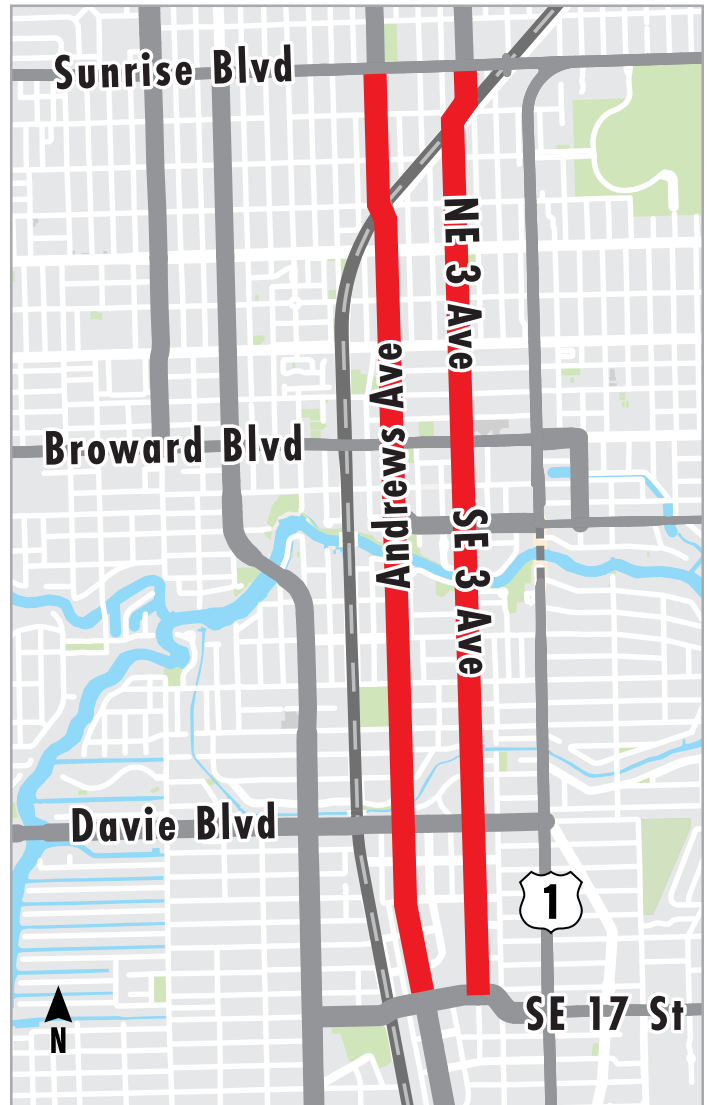

The City of Fort Lauderdale is conducting a study to assess the impact of converting Andrews Avenue and NE/SE 3rd Avenue into one-way pairs from Sunrise Boulevard to SE 17th Street.

The proposed concept is all lanes on one avenue heading northbound and all lanes on the other heading southbound. The study is examining how this change would affect motorists, public transit, bicyclists, and pedestrians.

We invite you to the second public meeting to review and provide input on the One-Way Pairs conceptual alternatives, including an alternative that maintains existing conditions.
